Backyard Birds of Quinta Mazatlan

As you pass through the gates of Quinta Mazatlan, you enter an urban oasis in the heart of McAllen for both man and wildlife.

Once on the grounds, you'll be greeted by our natives: Plain Chachalaca, White-winged Dove, Common Pauraque, Great Kiskadee, Couch's Kingbird, Green Jay, Clay-colored Thrush, Long-billed and Curve-billed Thrashers, Olive Sparrow and more.

Another year round resident is the Buff-bellied Hummingbird. During migration, our native gardens also attract the Ruby-throated, Black-chinned and Rufous Hummingbirds.

The birds enjoy selecting just the right nest cavity in our old palm trees. Look for the Red-crowned Parrot, Green Parakeet, Black-bellied Whistling-Duck and Eastern Screech-Owl.

The nature center is an oasis of food, water and shelter making it a welcome stopover for birds migrating through the Valley in spring and fall.

Quinta Mazatlan is a big backyard for wildlife. By providing plants, water and food you can provide important habitat for the birds!

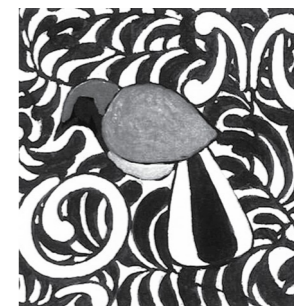
